Being big and thick are just the right qualifications - if you're a piece of British-grown oak.

Across Britain, we don't normally grow our oak in plantations, as happens on the continent. This means that harvested logs are often much bigger, giving architects

and designers more options in terms of structural beaming. In making high class furniture, the more figured, 'pippy' character oak is valued. With material pricing currently favouring British-grown wood, there's even more reason to investigate the potential of British-grown oak.
